A Brief Historical Account

Established as the first women's International Students' House in Delhi, the ISHW was founded on 3rd June 2002 by Professor Deepak Nayyar, Vice Chancellor, University of Delhi (North Campus) to provide accommodation facilities to foreign and Indian women students. The objective is to contribute to the growing role of India in promoting international understanding and setting up the goal to promote harmony and amity between countries of the world. The ISHW serves as a venue for cultural exchange as well as a living library for the study of past and present culture. Over the years, International Students' House for Women has proved to be a valuable experiment in International standing and cosmopolitan living hosting students from over 60 countries and bringing them together in their daily life presenting a happy blend of many cultures.

The International Students' House is a women's Hostel for full time undergraduate, postgraduate and M.Phil & Ph.D students of the University of Delhi. However in case of the Indian students (20 seats) we admit only postgraduate and above degree students.

While furthering its basic aim of promoting an atmosphere for academic excellence, the International Students' House for Women provides an ambience for nurturing creative talents to grow. It seeks to create a healthy environment through cultural and sports activities. Every resident is encouraged to take advantage of these facilities and contribute to the corporate life of the house. The House is consciously engaged in the task of building an environment of mutual understanding, warm friendship and appreciation among the residents.

The Provost is the Head of the House. The other administrative positions are of Warden & Resident Tutor. The staff of the Hostel is contractual in nature.
