
Dear Vice Chancellor,

The issue of development of national credit transfer framework has been drawing the attention of the Government for some time and a detailed discussions was also held on credit transfer framework during the Retreat of Vice Chancellors of Central Universities, Chaired by Hon'ble Minister of Human Resource Development at Chandigarh on 12th & 13th September, 2014.

2. In order to enhance efficiency and excellence in higher education system in the country and to mitigate the problems of students on migration from one Institution to another, the University Grants Commission has formulated Guidelines for adoption of uniform Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) across all the universities, a copy of which is enclosed for ready reference. The Guidelines have also been uploaded on the website of UGC (www.ugc.ac.in) and UGC has requested all the Institutions to implement this system. The Choice Based Credit System is to be implemented from the academic year, 2015-16.
3. I hope the Choice Based Credit System will ensure seamless mobility of students across the Higher Education Institutions in the country as well as abroad and the credits earned by the students can be transferred and would be of great value to the students in the event of their seeking migration from one institution to another.
4. I would emphasize that necessary action may be taken on priority for implementing the Choice Based Credit System in your Central University and an Action Taken Report be sent to this Ministry.
