The best practices of the Department:

1) Student feedback mechanism (IQAC)

The Department is one of the few departments of the University to institute a student's feedback system. Students are encouraged to fill up a questionnaire, and also give opinion on each course and each teacher in any given semester. The Department has revised some of the courses on the basis of student feedback.

2) Improvement classes for weak students:

Improvement classes are provided to language students over and above class hours.

3) Campus interview:

The Department has constituted a placement committee that looks after career opportunities for our language students. Multinational corporations conduct campus interview in coordination with the Department for employing full time students of Chinese, Japanese and Korean languages students.

4) Brail software for visually challenged students:

The facility is available for Japanese language students. The Department wishes to extend the facility for Chinese and Korean language as well.

5) Weekly Seminar:

The Department conducts seminar on Mondays for students and invites eminent faculty from Area Studies.

6) Our students participate in cultural and academic activities such as:

- Workshops/Seminars
- Speech and Essay Writing contest

organized by different Universities and associations.

7) Courses on Gender, Environment and Sustainability, Human values, Professional Ethics.

In each specific country courses we have encouraged and included courses on gender, human rights and law. By teaching society, culture and literature, we create awareness about three countries professional ethics and work culture.

All courses taught at Masters and PhD level include all issues related to Gender, Environment and sustainability, Human values, Professional Ethics.
