### **Globalisation, Democracy and Justice**

This project is an exploration of the distribution of inequalities and exclusions in the era of globalisation. By combining theoretical/philosophical approaches to the questions of democracy and justice with an intensive study of two categories ‘developmental corporation’ and ‘peace’, the project focused on practices of peace and development in Jammu and Kashmir. Broad disciplinary fields that this project covered was political theory, international relations, public administration, nationalism, human and rights and law. It had sought to reorient the way globalisation, democracy and justice is generally understood by way of reconfiguring the elements which are constituted as concerns of justice, democracy and globalisation.

### **Democracy, Norms and Institutions**

This research endeavour attempts to encapsulate the ongoing research of faculty members with the expectation that the academic activities of the department and its research output over the next five years will broadly impact on studying democracy, norms and institutions. The theme strings together three domains: ideas, institutional changes and political norms and practices. The project seeks to build on the basis analytical frameworks and modes of inquiry from different locations within the discipline of political science a critical epistemology on the question of democracy relates to institutional norms and changes.
