### **ESSENTIAL Qualifications for the teaching posts**

#### **Lecturer (Except Music & Social Work)**

1. Good academic record with at least 55% (50% for candidates belonging to SC/ST or those who passed their Master's degree prior to 19.09.91 and hold a Ph.D. degree) or an equivalent grade of B in the 7 point scale with letter grades O, A, B, C, D, E, & F at the Master's degree level in the relevant subject from an Indian University or an equivalent degree from a foreign University.
2. Candidates should have qualified the National Eligibility Test (NET) for Lecturers conducted by the UGC/CSIR or similar test accredited by the UGC. However, the candidates having Ph.D. degree in the concerned subject are exempted from NET for PG level and UG level teaching. The candidates having M.Phil. degree in the concerned subject are exempted from NET for UG level teaching only.

**Note:-** A relaxation of the minimum marks at the post-graduate level from 55% to 50% may be provided to the candidates who have cleared the JRF examination conducted by the UGC/CSIR only, prior to 1989, when the minimum marks required to appear for JRF examination were 50%.

#### **Lecturer (Music)**

1. Good academic record with at least 55% (50% for candidates belonging to SC/ST or those who passed their Master's degree prior to 19.09.91 and hold a Ph.D. degree) or an equivalent grade of B in the 7 point scale with letter grades O, A, B, C, D, E, & F at the Master's degree level in the relevant subject from an Indian University or an equivalent degree from a foreign University.
2. Candidates should have qualified the National Eligibility Test (NET) for Lecturers conducted by the UGC/CSIR or similar test accredited by the UGC. However, the candidates having Ph.D. degree in the concerned subject are exempted from NET for PG level and UG level teaching. The candidates having M.Phil. degree in the concerned subject are exempted from NET for UG level teaching only.

OR

A traditional or a professional artist with a highly commendable professional achievement in the subject concerned.

**Note:-** A relaxation of the minimum marks at the post-graduate level from 55% to 50% may be provided to the candidates who have cleared the JRF examination conducted by the UGC/CSIR only, prior to 1989, when the minimum marks required to appear for JRF examination were 50%.

#### **Lecturer (Social Work)**

Good academic record with at least 55% marks (50% for candidates belonging to SC/ST and those who passed their Master's degree prior to 19.09.91 and hold a Ph.D. degree or an equivalent grade) at Master's degree level or an equivalent qualification from an Indian or foreign University. Candidates, besides fulfilling the above qualifications, should have cleared the eligibility test for lecturers (NET) conducted by UGC, CSIR or similar test accredited by the UGC. However, the candidates having Ph.D. degree in the concerned subject are exempted from NET for PG level and UG level teaching. The candidates having M.Phil. degree in the concerned subject are exempted from NET for UG level teaching only.

**General Note**

1. A relaxation of 5% may be provided from 55% to 50% of the marks at the Master's level for the SC/ST/PH category.
2. B in the seven point scale with letter grade O, A, B, C, D, E & F shall be regarded as equivalent of 55% wherever the grading system is followed.
3. NET shall remain the compulsory requirement for appointment as Lecturer for those with post-graduate degree. However, the candidates having Ph.D. degree in the concerned subject are exempted from NET for PG level and UG level teaching. The candidates having M.Phil. degree in the concerned subject are exempted from NET for UG level teaching only.
4. A relaxation of minimum marks at the post-graduate level from 55% to 50% marks for appointment as Lecturer may be provided to the candidates who have cleared the JRF examination conducted by the UGC/CSIR only prior to 1989 when the minimum marks required to appear for JRF examination were 50% marks.
5. Provided that any relaxation in the prescribed qualifications can only be made by the UGC in a particular subject in which NET is not being conducted or enough number of candidates are not available with NET qualifications.
